The National Biosecurity Strategy focuses on:







- **Three components of the geographic and temporal biosecurity spectrum:**
 - within Australia
 - at-border
 - overseas
- **Three of the four sectors on the 'One Health' spectrum:**
 - agriculture
 - environment
 - marine / aquatic



Purpose of the National Biosecurity Strategy



NATIONAL BIOSECURITY STRATEGY

-  Outline and agree our collective **national vision, objectives and outcomes** for biosecurity in Australia to 2030
-  Seek to **drive coordinated reform and investment** to improve preparedness, management and responsiveness to emerging biosecurity threats and opportunities
-  Be **co-developed** by Australian, state and territory governments, as well as key stakeholders
-  Encourage **broad input** and incorporate **nation-wide engagement activities** run by the Commonwealth, states and territories
-  **Build** on – and **bring together** – the National Biosecurity Statement, Commonwealth Biosecurity 2030 and state / territory strategies and plans, the IGAB and existing deeds
-  Set out a high-level **implementation framework, outline strategic focus areas** and be supplemented by separate and more detailed action plans that are tracked and periodically review

We will enhance our **culture of biosecurity action** so that everyone understands its importance and plays their part.



Stronger partnerships

We will strengthen and expand **partnerships and networks** between all stakeholders at local, regional, national and international levels.



Highly skilled workforce

We will develop and sustain a **highly skilled workforce** to ensure we have the right capability and capacity, in the right place, at the right time.



Coordinated preparedness and response

We will boost our system's **adaptability and its capacity** to prevent, detect, manage, respond to and recover from outbreaks.



Sustainable investment

We will ensure **funding and investment** is sufficient, co-funded, transparent, targeted to our priorities and sustainable for the long term.



Integration supported by technology, research and data

We will create a more **connected, efficient and science-based** system to facilitate more timely, informed and risk-based decisions.
